David Ionovich Bronstein (Russian: Давид Ионович Бронштейн; February 19, 1924 – December 5, 2006) was a Soviet chess grandmaster, who narrowly missed becoming World Chess Champion in 1951. Bronstein was one of the world's strongest players from the mid-1940s into the mid-1970s, and was described by his peers as a creative genius and master of tactics.

Boris Spassky's Brilliancy over Bronstein goes to Hollywood!

Look at the position after 13. Bc2, where all of White's pieces seem to be focused on the Black King, and none of Black's pieces seem to be defending it. Usually in this kind of opening, Black uses the extra f pawn as a buffer for his own King, but Black took it out of position with 11...fxe3. This makes the position much more tactical and acute.

He helped revive the King's gambit, 1 and also wrote a popular book on one of his favorite weapons: Bronstein On the King's Indian.

On the occasion of David Bronstein's 75th birthday in February 1999, Garry Kasparov published a tribute on his web site in which he described him as 'the most enigmatic figure in the chess world', and mentioned that in the 1970s and even the 1980s he used to follow with interest Bronstein's games, in each of which some new and surprising idea could be found.

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
