Increasing temperatures, droughts, biotic stresses and the impacts of extreme events have continuously decreased agroforestry systems' resilience to the effects of climate change. As such, there is a need to adapt farming and agroforestry systems so as to make them better able to handle ever-changing climate conditions, and to preserve habitats and ecosystems services.

The adaptation of agroforestry impacts climate change by increasing the tree cover outside forests, enhancing forest carbon stocks, conserving biodiversity, reducing risks and damage intensity, maintaining health and vitality, and scaling up multiple benefits.

With better adaptation to climate change, forest-dependent people, smallholder agroforestry farmers, and the world as a whole, become more resilient against climate shocks. Effective, cost-efficient and equitable (3E+) policies and practices make use of forests, trees and agroforestry resources and combine climate change mitigation and adaptation with economic development.

Agroforestry and climate change

The ten countries of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations are highly vulnerable to the effects of climate change. Experts argue that agroforestry can help make the region's millions of smallholding farmers more resilient and secure food supply. Southeast Asia, with a population

of more than 600 million mostly reliant on agriculture and forests, is ranked high on measures of vulnerability to the impact of climate change.

6 Agroforestry as a means for adaptation. Their estimates show that at the end of the rotation, the accumulated income from tree products exceeds the accumulated value of crop yield lost through competition by US\$10 or 42% during average years and US\$22 or 180% with the assumption of 50% crop failure due to drought.

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
