### Reading Strategies and Comprehension Practice

Guided practice involves practice, feedback, reflection and refinement of skills. Guided practice with feedback means that we as teachers and trainers create and implement structured practice sessions that combine intentional, scaffolded (or graduated) practice with new content combined with coaching and formative (as they are increasing in mastery) feedback.

### Modeling and Practice | Quality-Plus Teaching Strategies

Guided Practice is the transition phase, where children take more control of their learning and the teacher slowly steps back. We keep the children up close on the rug during Guided Practice, so that we can monitor and support them easily and quickly.

Students who have received explicit instruction and guided practice can then practice the skills and strategies they have learned through student-directed activities such as peer tutoring and cooperative learning (Calderon et al., 1996; Muniz-Swicegood, 1994).

You can guide students through these four strategies during guided reading. Take turns letting each student predict, clarify, question, and summarize. Only a few weeks is needed (depending on age). Then students can use these strategies with peers without your support.

### Active Engagement Strategies with Instruction Components

During the interactive peer-collaboration guided-practice phase, students work together in small groups to practice the skill or concept. Teachers can incorporate cooperative learning structures at this point to maximize student participation and practice of the skills or concepts.

### Professional Support & Development / Effective Practices

Strategy in Practice Guided writing is taught to small groups in briskly paced, 20-minute lessons. These groupings should be flexible, based on observation of students' current needs, and might be implemented following a whole-class writing lesson. Engage students in a brief, shared experience.

### Maximize Learning with Guided Practice and Feedback ...

This Quality-Plus Teaching Strategy explicitly teaches "how" through intentional modeling. This strategy is part of a multi-step approach to skill acquisition that includes modeling, direct practice, guided practice, and independent practice to gradually release responsibility to the learner.

### Guided Practice Strategies

Guided practice is defined as scaffolded independent practice that occurs before minimally-assisted independent practice. During guided practice, the teacher empowers students to practice skills on their own for the first time, giving concrete, actionable feedback to everyone and additional focused attention to specific learners that need it.

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
