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Design Guidelines for Preservation Commissions

The design guidelines are a valuable resource for owners, designers, contractors and developers in planning a project and are also used by the Historic Landmark Commission and City Staff in the review of proposals affecting a landmark site or a property in a local historic district.

The Historic Preservation Review Board (HPRB) and Historic Preservation Office (HPO) use written design standards and guidelines to review construction affecting historic properties in the District of Columbia. In some cases, HPRB and HPO also use the nationwide historic preservation standards and guidelines issued by the National Park Service (NPS).

The Historic Preservation Commission developed Design Guidelines for downtown/commercial and residential properties that are Historic Landmarks or are located in the City's Historic Districts. The Commission utilizes the Secretary of Interior Standards for Rehabilitation to review Certificates of Appropriateness (or a "COA").

Historic and Design Review Commission (HDRC)

The Historic Design Guidelines provide historic district residents, property owners, professionals working with historic properties, and potential construction applicants a background history of the City's historic districts, an understanding of architectural design principles, and guidelines which promote predictability and ensure compatibility between new development and the existing historic environment.

The Design Guidelines address general issues regardless of historic character; however, they will assist property owners and designers identify issues and craft appropriate maintenance and design solutions for their historic buildings.

Design Guidelines and Ordinance Regulations | Historic ...

In the design review process, owners of locally designated landmarks and districts must get approval from a locally appointed historic preservation commission or architectural review board for major exterior alterations, additions, and new construction.

Landmark Design Guidelines Landmark Preservation reviews the designs of proposed exterior alterations, additions to buildings, new construction, signs, and non-vegetative site work for properties located within the boundaries of an historic district or for a property designated a Denver landmark.

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
