Surviving sections of Hadrian's Wall can be seen on the outskirts of Newcastle upon Tyne, at Denton, on the A69. The Roman name for Newcastle was 'Pons Aelius'.

In 1963, the University of Newcastle Upon Tyne became Newcastle's first university. The city had been home to the School Of Medicine and Surgery since 1834, and the University quickly became established as a traditional 'Red Brick', with a reputation for excellence.

### Historical Account of Newcastle-upon-Tyne | British ...

The first recorded settlement in what is now Newcastle was Pons Aelius (" Hadrian 's bridge"), a Roman fort and bridge across the River Tyne. It was given the family name of the Roman Emperor Hadrian, who founded it in the 2nd century AD.

### The History of Newcastle-upon-Tyne

The wool trade was especially important, and in 1353 Newcastle became a staple (wool-manufacturing) town. By the late Middle Ages it had a thriving cloth industry. In 1400 King Henry IV created Newcastle upon Tyne as a county corporate (a town with the administrative status of a county).
