In 1942, the Marine Corps found a new way to keep their communications secure with the Navajo Code Talkers. Marines from the Navajo tribe began to send secure voice transmissions based on their native language. Since only a small group of Americans spoke Navajo, it was impossible for the enemy to gain intelligence from any intercepted messages.
