## **Grant user access to a report server - SQL Server ...**

By default, the Local Administrators have a System Administrator permission to manage SQL Server Reporting Service. You must log in to the SSRS Report Manager via an account that already a member of the Local Administrator Group on the SSRS Server. Add the SQL Server Reporting Service Account to the Local Administrator Group.

## **Role Definitions -predefined roles - SQL Server Reporting ...**

APPLIES TO: SQL Server 2016 Power BI Report Server Reporting Services uses role-based security to grant user access to a report server. On a new report server installation, only users who are members of the local Administrators group have permissions to report server content and operations.

## **SSRS 2016: You are not allowed to view this folder ...**

I've installed Windows 10 and SQL Server 2014, with Reporting Services. SSRS has been configured (successfully), where I have used my DOMAIN/user (local administrator) account for the service account, and added this

same account through IE (running as administrator without UAC) to both the Home Folder Settings and the Site Settings.

### **SQL Server reporting services administrative access ...**

The System Administrator role is a predefined role that includes tasks that are useful for a report server administrator who has overall responsibility for a report server, but not necessarily for the content within it.

### **SQL Server Reporting Services Service - missing in Central ...**

The one thing that I swear I read somewhere... is to upgrade SQL Server... I have 2008 R2 at it's initial version. But SP2 +? a cumulative patch apparently (supposedly) fixes this print issue. It seems the SP's and various updates either turned on printing or turned it back off throughout 2008 R2's life.

### **Edge doesn't work with SSRS - Microsoft Community**

Reporting Services is installed with two default role assignments that grant item-level and system-level access to members of the local administrators group. These built-in role assignments local Administrators to grant report server access to other users and manage report server items. The built-in role assignments cannot be deleted.

### **Configure a Native Mode Report Server for Local ...**

In my case my current user "Chris" was also a SQL Server Administrator. The "Administrator" account was NOT a SQL Server Administrator, however WAS able to perform the actions that I was trying to take with the Reporting Services. – Chris Morley May 31 '09 at 12:54
